\$117.5 million to progress two renewable hydrogen hubs

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- McGowan Government puts \$117.5 million on the table to secure two Western Australian hydrogen hubs
- Renewable hydrogen hubs in the Pilbara and Mid-West would put WA at the forefront of the new industry
- Hubs would create about 2,000 jobs around the State
- Application submitted for matching funding from the Commonwealth Government

The McGowan Government will invest up to \$117.5 million to attract Federal funding for renewable hydrogen hubs in the Pilbara and Mid-West to drive Western Australia as a global clean energy powerhouse.

This week the State lodged applications through the Commonwealth Government's Clean Hydrogen Industrial Hubs program for matching Commonwealth funding to develop hubs in the Pilbara and Mid-West.

WA has globally competitive natural advantages in the renewable hydrogen industry - including abundant solar and wind resources, available land, existing export infrastructure and strong trading partnerships in the region.

The proposed hydrogen hubs capitalise on these natural advantages in the Pilbara and Mid West, and will help to fast-track renewable hydrogen production and exports from WA.

The Pilbara Hydrogen Hub plan involves development of a hydrogen or ammonia pipeline connecting the Maitland and Burrup strategic industrial areas, creation of a Clean Energy Training and Research Institute based out of both Karratha and Port Hedland, and port upgrades to facilitate export opportunities.

Minister for Regional Development; Agriculture and Food; Hydrogen Industry The Mid West Clean Hydrogen Hub proposal includes construction of renewable energy and road infrastructure at the Oakajee Strategic Industrial Area, as well as connecting the area to power and water, and developing hydrogen refuelling infrastructure.

Combined, the hubs would create around 2,000 skilled and semi-skilled jobs across the State.

The State Government's bids are supported by major resources industry companies including Woodside, Fortescue Future Industries, bp Australia, ATCO Australia, Australian Gas Infrastructure Group, Yara Pilbara, Engie, Rio Tinto and InterContinental Energy.
