Purpose

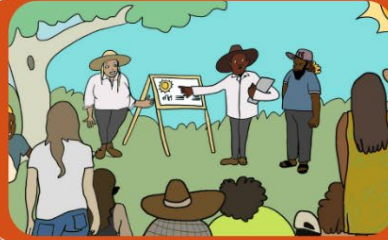
- To empower our first nations communities **drive** participation and clean energy transition.

We are working on a range of demonstration projects, from ~~in home~~ household energy security to stand along community energy systems and town solar microgrid- diesel integration to develop blueprints for best practice models that deliver community benefit.



Industry



- Asking Government to support our best practice requirements for working with community.

- Developing best practice principles guidelines to assist energy developers.



Policy

- First Nations Community Microgrids Program: \$83.8 million to develop and deploy microgrid technology across First Nations communities, to increase access to cheaper, cleaner and more reliable energy. The microgrid projects will be developed in consultation with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander groups, First Nations clean energy experts and the states and territories.

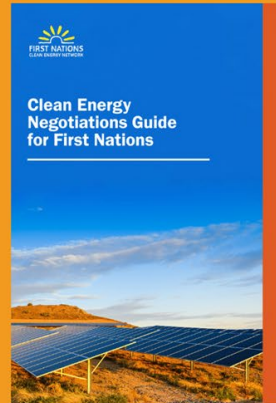
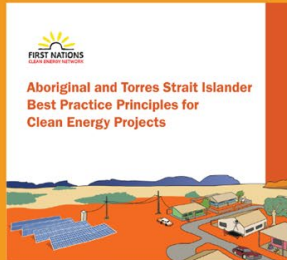
